



Restorative Nursing

The Restorative Nursing Module tracks documentation related to programs established to maintain resident functionality in ambulation, range of motion, bladder retraining, eating or swallowing, transfer training, dressing & grooming, meal preparation, and any other restorative program created by the facility to improve or maintain resident quality of care.

Restorative Nursing optionally connects to the MDS sections P3 and H3 for Health Care Facilities or provides restorative care outside of the MDS, simply by un-checking the MDS connection.

Charting is a check off and free text format and tracks frequency, discipline, nursing or supervisor review, and results, on a daily, weekly or monthly basis. The charting feature can be used with or without the built-in automation features.

Other features include:

- Staff can print out the assignments or enter activity directly into the Restorative Nursing program.
- User designed forms permit facilities to use familiar formats and charting entries. The Forms Designer is easy to use with step-by-step instructions through the creation of the custom form.
- Integration to Alerts and Messaging and color-coded Resident Lookup feature notifies staff of Restorative Orders and to check for new Restorative Plans for the required documentation.
- The Task List reminds staff to complete reviews, sign-offs and documentation. This feature is an easy method for a quick view of what is outstanding. It also helps to ensure that the Restorative Plan is being completed.
